## Commitment

- WNY is committed to the integration of environmental considerations into all areas of corporate activity and to implement a process of continual improvement in this regard to encourage sustainable opportunities on all our projects. This encompasses not only WNY's internal practices and procedures, but also the services, which it provides to clients. In each country in which it works, WNY shall comply with all legal requirements, including relevant codes and standards and any specific client requirements.

## Responsibility

- A WNY Board Director is responsible for WNY's Environmental Policy and for the effective implementation, maintenance and review of environmental management. The Director, Operations is responsible for its effective and economic operation and development on a day-to-day basis.
- Project directors are responsible for incorporating environmental mitigation measures into projects, as agreed with clients.

## Approach

- WNY aims to build all relevant environmental practices into its activities, and, as far as is reasonably practicable, energy and raw materials are drawn from sustainable and non-polluting sources and used effectively. WNY also aims to prevent pollution of any kind when conducting its activities. Environmental considerations are taken into account when procuring equipment, goods, materials and services for WNY. WNY is committed to recycling and reuse, as opposed to disposal, where feasible.
- WNY expects its employees and individuals working on its behalf to conduct their activities in an environmentally responsible manner. In all its activities, WNY will endeavor to bring relevant environmental issues to its clients' attention. The aim is to seek environmental protection and improvement through the services provided by WNY.
- To achieve this it is the policy of WNY's Board to operate an Integrated Management System (IMS).
